

More About Us

History

The Community Hall

Constructed by the Hockley Loyal Orange Lodge in 1894.

Used as an Orange Lodge until 1972, the hall was deeded to the Hockley & District Senior Citizens Club in 1976. An active club in the 1970's, 1980's and early 1990's, it has continued to be used as a community gathering and meeting place ever since. Many remember regular dances being held "back in the day".

The Church

Founded as a Primitive Methodist Church in 1869.

Originally built on Airport Road north of the Hockley Road and used from 1869 to 1884, it was closed after the various Methodist Church branches combined. It was acquired by the Hockley Methodists in 1887, cut in 4 sections and moved that winter by horse and wooden snow sleds to its present site in the village. The church held regular Sunday services until 2016.
